Schooling systems have always been built within fairly narrow windows of possibility. Offering quality public education to large numbers of students has always been an enterprise bound by the limits of our technology, economy, and polity. The world in 2018, however, presents categorically different limits than were the case in the time of Ryerson. We no longer need to summarize a year's worth of learning as a single letter - we can process every single assessment conducted in every class, if we so chose, in all of their detail. Our economy no longer wants to know if a person holds a single professional designation - the skills built around that designation are quickly eclipsing old professional categories. Our political system no longer respects the idea that there is a single form of knowledge that may be tested by a single form of examination. Our First Nations hosts, above all, deserve better. Capstone experiences, and career education, must recognize both that our capacity to understand student achievement has expanded dramatically, and that our responsibility to do so has moved with it. The future of education in British Columbia, thus, lies in the building of reporting and career planning systems that represent the breadth and dynamism of our time.
